




DR. JESSICA LATTMAN & DR. DAVID ROSENBERG

Dr. David Rosenberg is a board certified Facial Plastic and Reconstructive Surgeon renowned for his mastery of facial aesthetic surgery. Over the past decade Dr. Rosenberg has gained an international reputation for performing cosmetic facial operations that meld surgery and artistry. Patients routinely travel from around the globe in pursuit of his beautiful and natural results.

His surgical training included a fellowship sponsored by the American Academy of Facial Plastic Surgery, a residency in Otolaryngology at Manhattan Eye, Ear and Throat Hospital under the leadership of Chairman, Simon C. Parisier, MD and General Surgery at Lenox Hill Hospital. He received his Medical Degree from Cornell University Medical College after earning his undergraduate degree from Cornell University.

One of the foremost cosmetic surgeons in the world, Dr. Rosenberg's surgical techniques and modern aesthetic continuously garner attention in the press and at national conferences. He has been featured in *Forbes*, *Vogue*, *French Elle*, *Tattler*, *New York Magazine*, and *The New York Times*.

Dr. Jessica Lattman is a board certified ophthalmologist and fellowship trained oculoplastic surgeon. She expertly addresses both the cosmetic and reconstructive aspects of the eyelids. During her 15 years in private practice, she has developed advanced and innovative surgical techniques that allow her to provide her patients with natural and long lasting surgical results, with rapid recovery times. She is particularly known for her mastery of complicated cosmetic and reconstructive eyelid issues.

Dr. Lattman completed her residency training at Manhattan Eye, Ear & Throat Hospital and then went on to an advanced fellowship in ophthalmic plastic and reconstructive surgery. She graduated with honors from Cornell University and received her medical degree from New York University.

In addition to private practice, Dr. Lattman is a Clinical Assistant Professor at New York University where she supervises and teaches residents. Dr. Lattman has authored textbook chapters and numerous scientific articles in the field of ophthalmic plastic surgery and ophthalmology. She has been featured in *Vogue* and *New Beauty Magazine*.

Dr. Rosenberg and Dr. Lattman share a thriving private practice on the Upper East Side of Manhattan. They are married and live in Westchester with their three children.



ELAINE AND SIMON C. PARISIER, MD

When Dr. Simon C. Parisier, a world renowned Otologist, began his career in 1966, his goals were fairly straight forward – to help individuals with ear problems. In the 1970's his private practice consisted of patients who had diseases of the ear, dizzy patients and many deaf adults and children. The treatment of ear diseases took his surgical expertise to the highest level. The dizzy patients were treated with both surgical and rehabilitative approaches. But the profoundly deaf adults and children left him frustrated and powerless. Their options were to use sign language or read lips. In an effort to offer these patients a better alternative, he embarked on an approach that, at the time, was both controversial and risky.

Dr. Parisier's most significant accomplishment was his visionary exploration of cochlear implant technology with the goal of eliminating deafness. In 1979, he began his ground breaking work using this device, which is surgically placed in the cochlea to restore hearing to deaf individuals. Dr. Parisier and his wife Elaine recognized that this revolutionary, surgical intervention could not, in and of itself, ensure a young deaf child's ability to develop the hearing, speech, language, and learning skills that are necessary to attain educational success. And so, together they founded The Children's Hearing Institute in 1983. The Institute's mission would be to fund research into the efficacy of the cochlear implant as well as fund the critical educational and clinical services essential for a cochlear implant child's development of language and educational achievements.

It was 30 years ago when Elaine, the Institute's first Executive Director, had the foresight to recruit an admirable, philanthropic, committed Board of Directors to help achieve its mission. Under her dedication and leadership, the Institute has raised millions to support pioneering research as well as medical, educational, and therapeutic innovations that have improved the lives of children with hearing loss. Over the past three decades, it was Elaine's compassion, mentoring, and continued guidance that has created The Children's Hearing Institute we celebrate today.

Dr. Parisier will be retiring from private practice in May. However, he will continue to teach, sharing his vast knowledge and experience with the ENT residency program. Dedicated to The Children's Hearing Institute, both Dr. Parisier and Elaine will continue to remain active in its programs.

In celebration of 30 years of service and the countless lives Elaine and Simon Parisier have changed for the better, CHI is proud to acknowledge and honor their vision, commitment and dedication to humanity with the Lifetime Achievement Award.



THE CHILDREN'S HEARING INSTITUTE

As we celebrate the 30th Anniversary of The Children's Hearing Institute, it is truly remarkable to look back at the milestones we have reached, goals we have accomplished and, more importantly, the lives of the many children and families who have benefited from our services. ■ **Free Parent Workshops and Family Support Groups:** These meetings bring together children and their parents to socialize, discuss relevant topics, share common questions and concerns and learn about the resources available to them.

■ **Free Study Groups:** Professionals working with hearing impaired children are able to network, discuss strategies on particular cases within their school districts and learn about new advances in the field of deaf education and technology.

■ **Educational Outreach Program:** This program funds over 15 conferences a year, training and providing continuing education credit to over 1500+ professionals who work with hearing impaired children.

■ **School Based Education Services:** Our trained specialists educate parents on their child's hearing loss and the local, state and federal programs and mandates that apply to them. Counseling is provided on proper educational placement and modifications for school as well as an overview of the child's technology (hearing aids, cochlear implants and/or FM system).

■ **New York Eye & Ear Infirmary – Ear Institute:** Additional funding supports medical research and clinical and therapeutic services rendered at The New York Eye & Ear Infirmary's Cochlear Implant Center. The Institute's association with this visionary medical center enhances our ability to advance our mission to provide the gift of hearing to all infants and children in need.

Entering our 4th decade, CHI remains focused on the fact that hearing loss is America's number one birth defect and leading disability. Effecting more than 37 million Americans of all ages, hearing loss continues to be increasingly recognized as a public health crisis and we count on philanthropy more than ever to enhance our research capabilities, expand our educational outreach and further our innovative treatments for children.
